Are you an experienced HART (Hazardous Area Response Team) Paramedic skilled in coordinating responses to medical emergencies in hazardous zones?

UK-Med is a humanitarian INGO that has been responding to disasters and health emergencies for more than 20 years. We are core partners, providing the clinical component of the UK Emergency Medical Team (UK EMT) in line with WHO standards.

We are seeking individuals to join our teams in Ukraine, to be available to deploy in a HART Paramedic role. You will be able to make yourself available to work in Ukraine immediately for 6 weeks (longer availability may be an advantage), supporting the health needs of internally displaced persons.

The Paramedic will be responsible to support the pre-hospital care within the remit of the Ukraine emergency response to conflict affected populations and their healthcare professionals. They will participate in strengthening local healthcare staff capability in pre-hospital care. They will work closely with the clinical team lead, medical doctors and nurses to support mobile clinics/surgical units, acting as patient transfer focal point (if required) and advancing local capacity. If required as per deployment and context, paramedic role could be involved in patient care activities, although not the primary focus of the role.

The HART Paramedic will manage multiple streams of work, acting as a technical resource to support activities related to the context, ensuring that best guidance and standards are available for training and capacity under the Paramedic scope of practice. Along with the doctors and nurses they will play a central role in building the local capacity of any field staff (i.e., Ministry of Health or other NGOs), in areas related to the response, through training delivery.

You will be determined, high performing, compassionate and collaborative, as well as being committed to learning and supporting others to learn. A thorough understanding of CBRN (Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive) and Mass Casualty Situations is an essential, and language skills will be an advantage.

About UK-Med

UK-Med (www.uk-med.org)

We're a charity and our medical teams respond to disasters around the world. We work with local emergency teams to build their resilience to future threats.

UK-Med has been responding to emergencies since 1988, when a team of eight Manchester clinicians led by our founder Prof. Tony Redmond, went to Armenia in aid of those who had been hit by a devastating earthquake. When Ebola hit West Africa in 2014, killing over 11,000 people, we recruited, trained and sent 150 NHS clinicians to work in treatment centres alongside local health workers to help bring the outbreak under control.

We have deployed clinicians following numerous large-scale natural and manmade disasters, treating patients in emergencies in Armenia, Iran, China, Haiti, Nepal, Cape Verde Islands, Sierra Leone, Bangladesh, the Philippines, Gaza, Samoa, the Kurdish refugee crisis and the Siege of Sarajevo. We have delivered training to thousands of healthcare workers in local and regional medical teams in Sierra Leone, South Sudan, China, Malawi, Myanmar, Armenia and Uganda.

Our core staff team of around 30 provides programme management and technical health expertise, logistics, fundraising and communications, finance, HR and administrative support. Our humanitarian responses are staffed by our membership - a combination of volunteers seconded from NHS employers and experienced NGO workers hired on a contingent basis for specific responses. Currently we have a membership of around 1000 people (mostly healthcare professionals and experienced NGO support staff) who have been through selection procedures, vetting and induction/training.

The UK EMT

We are a partner in the UK Emergency Medical Team (UK EMT), the front line of the UK government's response to a humanitarian crisis overseas, funded by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO).

We prepare rapid deployment teams ready to respond to various health emergencies anywhere in the world within twenty-four hours. We can respond following earthquakes, cyclones, hurricanes, disease outbreaks or to other humanitarian contexts. Depending on the needs, we might deploy individual personnel, small clinical or advisory teams or full self-sufficient treatment centres.

The EMT network is driven by the World Health Organisation (WHO) and ensures that teams that respond following disasters are well trained, self-sufficient and have the skills and equipment to respond effectively rather than imposing a burden on the national system.

Job Title	HART Paramedic (Hazardous Area Response Team)
Place of work	Ukraine

Purpose of role

To provide assessment and training and/or capacity building to Ukraine Emergency Response (various settings/areas in the country, including within a hazardous environment (HART)), in order to provide the most appropriate support for conflict-affected populations. To provide paramedic/pre-hospital care, when require according to mission and response needs.

Key responsibilities

Expert advisory and Capacity building

- Support the professional development of other personnel through delivery of training, coaching, reviews or other mechanisms deemed needed for continuity of activities as per MedCo/team leader feedback, particularly in areas of relevant sub-specialty (e.g., HART, CBRN, etc)
- 2 Review and develop technical materials, tools, guidelines and documents (as per local needs), related to paramedic activities (e.g., standard protocols and procedures, training packages), as per deployment request adapting where appropriate.
- Provide technical assistance to the MoH and other agencies/organisations, making sure that the provision of practical recommendations can be realistically implemented.
- Participate in rapid appraisals of pre-hospital facilities and pathways if requested and report on the levels of implementation that may be required in response planning.
- 5 Build local capacity of the MoH field staff in areas related to the response activities.
- 6 Perform ad hoc duties, as assigned by the clinical team lead.
- Participate in the preparation of any agreed team weekly report (Sitrep) and Medical monthly reporting. Contribute to donor proposals donor and internal reports as requested.
- Prepare an end of deployment report with a summary of activities and recommendations for replacement position/upon medical lead request.

Clinical practice (if requested as per mission needs)

- 9 Ensure the quality of care provided to patients, with best-practice clinical case management and the strict implementation of SOPs and treatment guidelines, if requested for clinical work.
- Support definition of referral pathways maintaining up to date knowledge of contextual challenges, if requested by Medical Lead.
- Analyse and report on existing available patient data and undertake good patient record management and support the data management process (patient confidentiality; adherence to the data protection laws within the country context, if involved in clinical case management).
- 12 Advocate for optimal care and outcomes for all patients, bearing in mind safeguarding protocols.
