This is an exciting time to join UK-Med. We have expanded significantly over the last few years and have an ambitious strategy in place for growth.

The world is experiencing an unprecedented level of humanitarian need. Natural disasters, disease outbreaks and conflict can hit at any time. The people affected are often the poorest and most vulnerable and the health problems they experience post-disaster are long-lasting. As such we are at the front line of the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office's response to humanitarian crisis and can also respond to any crisis, anywhere in the world, under our own banner.

## About UK-Med

### UK-Med ([www.uk-med.org](http://www.uk-med.org))

We train and deploy medical teams and specialists to save lives when epidemics, conflict and natural disasters hit. As disasters grow more frequent, severe and complex there has never been a greater need to respond quickly and effectively. We believe in a world prepared to help.

It started in 1988 with a team of eight Manchester clinicians led by our founder Tony Redmond, when a huge earthquake ripped through Armenia. Teams continued to deploy throughout the 1990's and 2000s, and when Ebola struck West Africa in 2014 UK-Med stepped up. We recruited and trained the one hundred and fifty UK clinicians who worked alongside local medical teams, other NGOs and DFID to bring the outbreak under control.

UK-Med has deployed teams to a range of countries and crises including Cape Verde, China, Gaza, Haiti, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Indonesia, Jordan, Kosovo, Pakistan, the Philippines, Sierra Leone and Bangladesh. Our teams have undertaken a range of work on deployment including general medical care, trauma and surgical care, outbreak response and training of local healthcare staff.

### The UK EMT

The UK Emergency Medical Team (UK EMT) provides high quality emergency health care solutions in a range of humanitarian contexts on behalf of the UK Government. The programme is led by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) and works under the guidelines of the WHO Classification and Minimum Standards for Medical Teams in sudden onset disasters. We recruit and train teams of UK-based clinicians, normally released for three weeks at a time by NHS employers. At any time, we have a team of sixty clinicians on call who are ready to respond to disasters anywhere in the world within twenty-four hours.

We can respond following earthquakes, cyclones, hurricanes, disease outbreaks or to other humanitarian contexts. Depending on the needs, we might deploy individual personnel, small clinical or advisory teams, self-sufficient primary care facilities or a field hospital including surgical team and inpatient facilities.

### Purpose of role

- In the project area/country, provide and monitor mental health and psychosocial UK-MED related activities in accordance with the Mental Health Strategy and UK-MED protocols/standards
- To assist in the development of an MHPSS strategy that is tailored to the local environment and needs, as well as the coordination of MHPSS activities, in order to offer the best possible care for patients (including management of staff, ensuring the quality of care delivered and reporting).
- Prepare an end of deployment report with a summary of activities and recommendations (for replacement position/upon MedCo request) and SITREPs, as per request.

### Key responsibilities

1	Identifying the needs of MH support in the target population and participating in the definition, planning, organization and update of the appropriate UK-Med strategy and the Mental Health (MH) and Psychosocial Activities (PSS) activities, in partnership with local NGOs.
2	Coordinate and ensure that Mental Health activities are performed with regular follow-up in order to provide the most appropriate treatment for clients with psychosocial issues.
3	Review and develop technical materials, tools, guidelines and documents (as per local needs), and coordinate and ensuring the implementation of all Mental Health standard protocols and procedures set by international validated guidance in collaboration with the MHPSS supervisor.
4	Mapping and regularly update the existing Mental Health services, including other INGO's, local NGO's, community groups and governmental health services, etc. and maintaining good and regular communication and collaboration with other components of the project according to objectives and context.
5	Identifying & report possible Protection and/or SGBV cases/issues & referral any to existing support services.
6	Regular report and exchanges with the medical coordinator as well as regular updates and exchanges with the Medical Team Leaders of the different fields Inform MedCO/ Team Leader of the project about Protection and/or SGBV cases/issues

7	Data collection and follow-up to improve the quality of the activities/intervention
8	Working on the continuity of the confidentiality in the practice and the data collection
<b>Liaison and networking</b>	
9	Liase with MHPSS Working groups & other relevant humanitarian actors for collaboration and partnership to strengthen local capacity in the field.
<b>Monitoring and Evaluation</b>	
10	Monitoring and evaluating MH support activities as per UK-MED policy through regular data collection and reporting
<b>Non-Routine Activities</b>	
1	Conduct individual team members appraisal reports at the end of a deployment and/or mid-term points.
2	Comply with UK-Med policies and practice with respect to child protection, code of conduct, health and safety, equal opportunities and other relevant policies and procedures.
3	Submit any appropriate contributions to the end of mission report, specifically technical input relating to activities undertaken.
4	Ad hoc duties as directed by the Medical Team Lead.
