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Introduction



This is an exciting time to join UK-Med. We have expanded significantly over the last few years and have an ambitious strategy in place for growth.

The world is experiencing an unprecedented level of humanitarian need. Natural disasters, disease outbreaks and conflict can hit at any time. The people affected are often the poorest and most vulnerable and the health problems they experience post-disaster are long-lasting. We believe that they deserve the highest quality emergency medical aid. We seek to save lives, but also to build resilient health systems so that people can lead healthy lives in the future.

At UK-Med, we work together to:

- **Respond** rapidly to emergencies, delivering the expertise needed to support local health services and save people's lives.

In June 2022, we were awarded EMT (Emergency Medical Team) status by the World Health Organization. A month later, we were formally appointed to provide EMT services for the UK government. As such we are at the front line of the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office's response to humanitarian crisis and can also respond to any crisis, anywhere in the world, under our own banner.

UK-Med is a frontline medical aid charity. Born of the NHS, we've been working for over 30 years towards a world where everyone has the healthcare they need when crises or disasters hit.

We are looking for an experienced Senior Data and Information Management Officer who will be able to work closely with our Medical Coordinator and Medical Team Lead to provide assistance and support the needs of the Ukrainian population based on both internal needs assessment, Ministry of Health in country and WHO health assessments.

You will support in strengthening the Data management systems for UK-Med programme in Ukraine. This includes to oversee the development and use of health data tools and systems to support the health data management in communities served by the in country mobile clinics in different Oblasts in country and the surgical field activities, in response to the internal displacement/refugee crisis due to the ongoing conflict, and to help to strengthen dialogue between the UK-Med medical staff and the communities served.

The work of the Senior Data and Information Management Officer might be located in different areas, based on the needs and as defined by the Medical Coordinator of the mission and the Health Advisor for Ukraine at HQ.

You will have a positive and flexible problem-solving approach and be willing, able, and ready to deploy to support all UK-Med programmes and projects.

About UK-Med

UK-Med (www.uk-med.org)

We train and deploy medical teams and specialists to save lives when epidemics, conflict and natural disasters hit. As disasters grow more frequent, severe and complex there has never been a greater need to respond quickly and effectively. We believe in a world prepared to help.

It started in 1988 with a team of eight Manchester clinicians led by our founder Tony Redmond, when a huge earthquake ripped through Armenia. Teams continued to deploy throughout the 1990's and 2000s, and when Ebola struck West Africa in 2014 UK-Med stepped up. We recruited and trained the one hundred and fifty UK clinicians who worked alongside local medical teams, other NGOs and DFID to bring the outbreak under control.

UK-Med has deployed teams to a range of countries and crises including Cape Verde, China, Gaza, Haiti, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Indonesia, Jordan, Kosovo, Pakistan, the Philippines, Sierra Leone and Bangladesh. Our teams have undertaken a range of work on deployment including general medical care, trauma and surgical care, outbreak response and training of local healthcare staff.

The UK EMT

The UK Emergency Medical Team (UK EMT) provides high quality emergency health care solutions in a range of humanitarian contexts on behalf of the UK Government. The programme is led by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) and works under the guidelines of the WHO Classification and Minimum Standards for Medical Teams in sudden onset disasters. We recruit and train teams of UK-based clinicians, normally released for three weeks at a time by NHS employers. At any time, we have a team of sixty clinicians on call who are ready to respond to disasters anywhere in the world within twenty-four hours.

We can respond following earthquakes, cyclones, hurricanes, disease outbreaks or to other humanitarian contexts. Depending on the needs, we might deploy individual personnel, small clinical or advisory teams, self-sufficient primary care facilities or a field hospital including surgical team and inpatient facilities.

Purpose of role

- Creating and implementing policies and procedures for effective data management.
- Formulating management techniques for quality data collection to ensure adequacy, accuracy, and legitimacy of health data (Data collection, analysis, reporting, monitoring and evaluation processes with attention to security and confidentiality)
- Devising and implementing efficient and secure procedures for data management and analysis with attention to all technical aspects and in country resources.

Key responsibilities

1	Develop an assessment and plan of action for the Data Management and development of a Health Information system for Ukraine focusing on Data collection, analysis, reporting, monitoring and evaluation processes, in line with Country programme priorities and Health Advisor recommendations
2	Create, review, and adapt data collection tools according to the project indicators, and coordinating the development, implementation and follow up of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for documentation.
3	Develop Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for documentation and implement data quality assurance methods to ensure good performance of the activities and reliability of the information, treating with respect and confidentiality all patient information
4	Provide technical support to the medical team and data entry staff in the implementation of routine data recording, collection, and entry for the selected project indicators in clinics and/or hospitals and/or health centres. Organizing and implementing or providing technical support in the establishment of monitoring tools for new activities as initiated in the project.
5	Provide training to Data clerks/ officers in line with the above point.
6	Where required, implementing detailed analysis of recorder data for key indicators for the project to facilitate the definition, redefinition or reorientation of project activity – share input with Medical Coordinator and MEAL Manager.
7	Following analysis, identifying, and reporting any new and interesting indicators for review with the medical team for potential follow up where relevant.

8	Supporting work of the data team personnel for quality assurance, including identification of training needs and providing coaching for the staff on issues related to data.
9	Planning and supervising, with support of the HR department, any associated HR processes (recruitment, training/induction, evaluation, potential detection, motivation, development) of the data team in order to ensure having the appropriate team in terms of size, capabilities and skills, if requested by the in-country Medical Coordinator.
10	Participating in meetings and/or trainings as requested/scheduled by manager (UK-MED internal meetings and/or trainings, and local, regional, or international meetings and/or trainings).
11	On a weekly and monthly basis and in collaboration with the medical team, support the preparation and submission of summary reports on analysed data for UK-Med Health programme, liaising closely with Medical Coordinator and MEAL manager.
12	Performing additional activities whenever needed and as requested by the supervisor.
Safeguarding	
13	Comply with and uphold UK-Med safeguarding policies (including child protection, prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse, bullying and harassment) and all Codes of Conduct.
14	Report all possible breaches of policy or Codes of Conduct through the appropriate channels in a timely fashion.
