This is an exciting time to join UK-Med. We have expanded significantly over the last few years and have an ambitious strategy in place for growth.

The world is experiencing an unprecedented level of humanitarian need. Natural disasters, disease outbreaks and conflict can hit at any time. The people affected are often the poorest and most vulnerable and the health problems they experience post-disaster are long-lasting. We believe that they deserve the highest quality emergency medical aid. We seek to save lives, but also to build resilient health systems so that people can lead healthy lives in the future.

At UK-Med, we work together to:

In June 2022, we were awarded EMT (Emergency Medical Team) status by the World Health Organization. A month later, we were formally appointed to provide EMT services for the UK government. As such we are at the front line of the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office's response to humanitarian crisis and can also respond to any crisis, anywhere in the world, under our own banner.

We are very excited about our plans and hope you will join us on this extraordinary journey.

We are seeking for Surgeons with orthopaedic / Trauma experience working in humanitarian contexts. You will be able to make yourself available to travel and work internationally at short notice for a minimum of 2 weeks (longer availability is highly desirable).

Our ideal candidates will be fully licensed and experienced Orthopaedic / Trauma Surgeon, providing medical care to patients with a wide range of medical conditions.

Most of our surgeons need to be confident and capable in treatment of both adults and children. Previous experience in low resource / humanitarian / conflict contexts may be an advantage but is not essential.

You must be a fully licensed Orthopaedic / Trauma Surgeon, registered with an appropriate professional body. You must hold a Degree in Medicine with speciality training in orthopaedic surgery.

You will be determined, high performing, compassionate and collaborative, as well as being committed to learning and supporting others to learn. Language skills will be an advantage. You will have a positive and flexible problem-solving approach and be willing, able, and ready to deploy to support all UK-Med programmes and projects.

About UK-Med

UK-Med (www.uk-med.org)

We train and deploy medical teams and specialists to save lives when epidemics, conflict and natural disasters hit. As disasters grow more frequent, severe and complex there has never been a greater need to respond quickly and effectively. We believe in a world prepared to help.

It started in 1988 with a team of eight Manchester clinicians led by our founder Tony Redmond, when a huge earthquake ripped through Armenia. Teams continued to deploy throughout the 1990's and 2000s, and when Ebola struck West Africa in 2014 UK-Med stepped up. We recruited and trained the one hundred and fifty UK clinicians who worked alongside local medical teams, other NGOs and DFID to bring the outbreak under control.

UK-Med has deployed teams to a range of countries and crises including Cape Verde, China, Gaza, Haiti, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Indonesia, Jordan, Kosovo, Pakistan, the Philippines, Sierra Leone and Bangladesh. Our teams have undertaken a range of work on deployment including general medical care, trauma and surgical care, outbreak response and training of local healthcare staff.

The UK EMT

The UK Emergency Medical Team (UK EMT) provides high quality emergency health care solutions in a range of humanitarian contexts on behalf of the UK Government. The programme is led by the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) and works under the guidelines of the WHO Classification and Minimum Standards for Medical Teams in sudden onset disasters. We recruit and train teams of UK-based clinicians, normally released for three weeks at a time by NHS employers. At any time, we have a team of sixty clinicians on call who are ready to respond to disasters anywhere in the world within twenty-four hours.

We can respond following earthquakes, cyclones, hurricanes, disease outbreaks or to other humanitarian contexts. Depending on the needs, we might deploy individual personnel, small clinical or advisory teams, self-sufficient primary care facilities or a field hospital including surgical team and inpatient facilities.

Job Title	Orthopaedist / Trauma Surgeon (emergency humanitarian aid)
Reports to	Medical Coordinator / Health Advisor
Duration	Minimum of 2 weeks at a time (longer availability is highly desirable).
Place of work	Internationally/any of the UK-Med response including Ukraine and or to various field offices.

Purpose of role

Perform, examine and review surgical procedures to address various medical needs for patients in the field and support the capacity building of the health systems; work with a multidisciplinary team of health professionals overseeing the medical and surgical care of patients.

Key responsibilities

1	Work in collaboration with UK-Med hospital team and hospital staff.
2	Perform surgical procedures to high standards, in order to prevent or correct injury, disease, deformities and patient function while adhering to all regulatory and ethical protocols.
3	Follow established surgical techniques during surgery to optimise patient outcomes.
4	Prescribe preoperative and postoperative treatment and procedures and work together with other members of the clinical team to support this.
5	Ensure sterility in the operating room, and all equipment and instruments to minimize patient infections and poor outcomes.
6	Advise on activities of hospital staff for proper patient care and enhancements in supported facilities.
7	Oversee all treatment prior to and post-surgery and identify associated risks.
8	Where required, schedule follow -up visits with patients to ensure continuing health.
9	Maintaining detailed patient records on paper or digitally, and participate to the UK-Med.
10	Coordinating with other medical professionals (national and international) like Anaesthesiologists and Nurses to ensure successful and safe treatment.
11	Performing any additional activities whenever needed and as requested by the supervisor to improve surgical capacity and/or patient treatment outcomes.
12	Organise training and capacity building activities as appropriate and in agreement with MTL/MedCo

Safeguarding
